

Collection Services



Recology provides a wide variety of cart and container sizes and service frequency options. Some services are not available in select areas, and some cities have restrictions on container sizes. Call or email our Customer Service team for details on special services or rules that apply in your area.

Collection Set Out Time

For curbside service, set your cart out by **6 AM on your collection day** (or the night before). Your actual service time may vary from week to week. Many cities require that carts are brought back in within 24 hours after collection to ensure the public right-of-way. This includes sidewalks, driveways, and roadside locations.

Curbside Placement

Please place your carts within 4ft of the curb or road's edge and 4ft from other carts and obstacles, such as cars, trees, basketball hoops, and mailboxes.

Missed Collection

If your cart service did not happen as scheduled, email or call our Customer Service team to discuss options. Fees may apply.

Extra Garbage

Place loose items in bags or boxes. There is an additional fee for extra garbage if the cart is overflowing AND/OR the lid does not close. Driver will service up to one additional cart of extra garbage. Extra garbage over that amount will require preauthorization, please email or call Customer Service. Fees apply for all extra garbage.

Your recycling service calendar can be found in this guide. If you have less-than-weekly garbage service, you can find your service calendar on our website or contact our office to have one sent to you.

Rural Recycling

Recycling collection is available in some rural areas for an additional monthly charge. Please contact us to see if your address is included.

Holiday Service

On most holidays, Recology operates as usual. Recology does not collect on Thanksgiving and Christmas day. During those times, service is delayed by one day for the remainder of the week.

For example, during Thanksgiving week, Thursday customers will be collected on Friday, and Friday customers will be collected on Saturday. In 2022, Christmas falls on Sunday, so no residential customers are affected. In 2023, Christmas falls on Monday, so service will be delayed by one day for all residential customers for the rest of the week (Monday customers on Tuesday, Tuesday customers on Wednesday, etc.).

Preparing for a Storm



- Bag all garbage and tie bags closed before placing in your garbage container. Recyclables should be placed loose in your cart, but can be secured inside larger boxes or paper bags.
- 2. Don't overload your cart. If the lid is partially open, it will blow open in strong winds.
- 3. Do not put your cart out overnight if the forecast calls for windy and/or stormy weather. However, carts DO need to be out by 6 AM on collection day.

Secure Your Lid

Place a rock or another large object on top of the cart.

Please no bungee cords—serious injuries can occur!

Wind Latch

We offer a variety of solutions designed to help stop the wind from blowing open the lids of our carts. Please call for options and pricing.

Temporary Boxes

We offer 3, 10, 20, and 30 cubic yard boxes. If your home was built before 2004, you may need an asbestos survey before we can deliver a box to you. Call for more information and proper disposal options.

Bulky Item Pick Ups

Recology collects mattresses, computers, TVs, appliances, and more! Give us a call to schedule a curbside collection. Service charges and disposal fees apply for most items.





Setting Up an Online Account

- 1. Visit Recology.com
- 2. Click on "My Recology"
- 3. Enter your zip code in the pop-up window and click "submit"
- 4. Click on "Pay My Bill"
- 5. Click on "Enroll" to set up a new online account
 Note: Click on "One Time Payment" to pay online without creating an account
- **6.** Fill out the online form with your information. The password must be:
 - a. At least 3 letters with at least 1 upper and 1 lower case letter
 - b. At least 1 number
 - c. At least 1 special character (@#%^-_+ only)
 - d. Between 8 and 30 characters long

PLEASE NOTE

In the House Number field, enter only the house number of the service address, not the street name or apartment number.

Once submitted, an online account will be created for your Recology Western Oregon bill. All future statements will be emailed as long as your online account is active.

To pay your Recology statement by phone, please call 971.312.0178 and have your account number ready.

Why Recycle?

- Saves water, energy, and other natural resources like trees, minerals, natural gas, and oil.
- 2. Reduces the amount of waste sent to landfills.
- **3.** Prevents pollution by reducing the need to collect new raw materials.
- 4. Helps create jobs in recycling and manufacturing.
- May help lower your garbage bill by allowing you to switch to a smaller container or less frequent service.

Waste Reduction and Reuse are even better than Recycling!

When you choose to reduce, and reuse, less material, energy, and natural resources are used in the product's lifecycle. You also avoid the emissions from the extraction, processing, and transport of new goods. With the power of Reuse, Reduce, and Repair, the impacts for our environment are out of this world!

OUR TOP 10 REDUCTION TIPS

- 1. Carry a reusable water bottle and refill it often!
- **2.** Take your own mug to the coffee shop.
- 3. Carry canvas bags when grocery shopping.
- 4. Buy loose fruits and vegetables.
- Choose reusable containers to store food and for packing lunches.
- 6. Refuse single-use plastics when possible.
- **7.** Buy in bulk to eliminate packaging.
- **8.** Shop at stores that re-sell clothing, furniture, appliances, and tools.
- 9. Use cloth napkins instead of paper ones.
- **10.** Try to repair broken items before replacing them.

Home Composting

Composting your yard trimmings and kitchen scraps is a great way to help your plants and reduce the amount of waste you generate.



START A HOME COMPOSTING SYSTEM!

- 1. Build or buy a compost bin, or just make a pile.
- 2. Mix two parts greens (grass, leaves, and flowers) to one part browns (dry leaves, sticks, and twigs)
- Some kitchen scraps are acceptable (vegetable and fruit peels, eggshells, coffee grounds).

 No meat or dairy products—these can attract rodents and flies and cause bad odors.
- Turn and water regularly; keep your pile moist (like a damp sponge), and move the material around using a pitchfork or shovel.

WHY USE COMPOST?

Compost increases water retention, decreases the need for chemical fertilizers and pesticides, and helps keep a useful resource from going to waste!

Yard Debris Recycling

Customers living within the city limits of Astoria, Gearhart and Cannon Beach can bring their clean yard trimmings to the Astoria Transfer Station at no charge. All others are charged by the cubic yard to drop off material. Gearhart customers can also use the drop-off at Gearhart City Hall, and Cannon Beach customers can use the drop-off at the Cannon Beach recycling depot. Customers pay for these programs as part of their collection service. Seaside Fire Dept. offers yard debris recycling at no charge to city of Seaside residents.

FOLLOW 3 SIMPLE **RULES:**





- Empty any residual food or liquid.
- Clean the product by quickly rinsing or scraping off debris.
- Shake the container to remove moisture before tossing in your recycling carts.
- Do not use plastic bags; paper bags or boxes are OK.
- No items smaller than a tennis ball.
- Remove all lids.

- Electronics: Computers, monitors, laptops, etc.
- Glass Bottles and Jars No glass dishware or drinking glasses
- Yard Waste: Grass, leaves, branches, and flowers No dirt, sod or stumps
- Motor Oil: Place oil in a see through plastic jug with a tight fitting lid

TOP CONTAMINANTS

- Glass bottles can be brought to a local depot.
- Electronics can be dropped off at the Astoria Transfer Station.
- Plastic bags can be taken to some local grocery stores.
- Plastic clamshells, takeout containers, coffee pods, and diapers go in the garbage.

E-Waste

Oregon E-Cycles is a free recycling program for computers, TVs, and monitors. The program is funded by manufacturers, with oversight from Oregon DEQ. Drop off items at the Astoria Transfer Station.

For large quantities, call ahead to make an appointment. TVs, computers, monitors, and laptops are prohibited from the landfill. Please do not place them in the garbage.

Medical Waste

Medical waste and sharps (e.g., needles, syringes) cannot be thrown out with the regular garbage. We offer safe, efficient disposal using approved containers—contact us for more information and pricing.

Paint Recycling

Recycling Depots

ASTORIA TRANSFER STATION 1790 Williamsport Road, Astoria

- Accepted at the Scalehouse: Garbage, yard debris, wood, tires, appliances, electronics, and car batteries. Fees apply for most items.
- Accepted at the Self-Service Recycling Depot: Glass bottles and jars, cardboard, paper, tin and aluminum cans, motor oil, and rigid plastic bottles and tubs. No fees apply.

Available every weekend Friday afternoon-Monday morning

Never leave garbage. Never leave recycling when containers are not present.

Available every other weekend Friday afternoon–Monday morning

Accepted: Mixed recycling and glass only

WARRENTON DEPOT

Accepted: Glass and cardboard only

GEARHART DEPOT

698 Pacific Way, Gearhart

Accepted: Yard debris and glass Gearhart residents only.

CANNON BEACH DEPOT

East 2nd Street and Spruce Street, Cannon Beach

 Accepted: Yard debris, mixed recycling, cardboard, and glass

Cannon Beach residents only.

SEASIDE DEPOT

Avenue S and Alder Mill Ave, Seaside

Accepted: Mixed recycling, cardboard, and glass
